Venue

The arena is located 2 kilometers north of the small village of Mazaugues, alongside road D64. Parking location : OpenStreetMap / GoogleMap No parking fee.

Warning : access to the competition is difficult through the small village of Mazaugues for long vehicles. Camper vans and coaches of more than 10 meters must access the competition site via Tourves by D1 and D64.



3. CFRS (St-Maximin-la-Ste-Baume, 1.4.2024)

Parking area available to spend the night, close to the Mazaugues stadium, 2 km away from the arena. Link to the parking here. Possible from Friday 29. Toilets on site.

Arena

The arena is located 600m to 1 km at walking distance west from the parking area. Please follow the markings and be aware when crossing the D64 road.

Embargoed areas

The embargo of the competition terrain of Mazaugues (CFMD and CFC) was published in April 2023, after the use of the map by the French federation for a training weekend of the MW21 and MW20 teams.

Terrain

Mediterranean terrain. Flat karstic plateau around 400 meters above sea level, presenting some areas rich in rocky details (rocky pits, bare rocks with deep trenches). Mostly semi-open mediterranean vegetation ("garrigue") quickly varying from very dense and bushy, to more open and possibly very fast (large open bare rocks). Rest of the terrain is covered with pine and oak forests, most often quite dense. Only a few paths. Runnability from very good in open areas to very low in rocky or denser areas. Covered legs recommended. Maximum altitude difference is about 70 meters (370–430m).

Competition rules

The rules of the International Orienteering Federation will be applied in the competition. Spiked shoes are allowed, but shoes with studs are recommended.

Competitors shall not use or carry telecommunication equipment between entering the pre-start area and reaching the finish in a race, unless the equipment is approved by the organiser. GPS-enabled devices (watches etc.) can be carried provided that:

- they have no map display
- they have no telecommunication ability.
- they are not used for navigation purposes.

However, the organiser has the right to specifically forbid the use of such equipment.

The organiser may require competitors to carry a tracking device and/or a GPS data logger.

First start : 12:00

There will be more information on the organizer's web page closer to the date of the competition. Final event instructions, details of the courses and start times will be published in Bulletin 2 and on the competition website.











Entries and entry fees

Entries should be made primarily via Eventor. All WRE competitors make an entry to classes M/W21 E. Entry fee in WRE classes is 15,50 \in . SI card number must be included in the entry. Need for SI card rental must be issued with the entry. If the SI card number is missing, the organiser will reserve an SI card and charge 5 \in . The IOF World Ranking system only uses the Latin alphabet from A to Z. It is very important for all runners to check that the information about them is correct. Please check the following : the spelling of your first and last name, year of birth and nationality. If you find any mistakes, please report them via email changes athletedata(at)orienteering.org. When reporting, make sure you add your complete birth date. It is not possible to pay through Eventor.
